PSPNet: Self-Guided PSP Wellbeing Course

54 CE credits

This self-guided course provides free education and guidance on effective skills for managing various mental health concerns, such as depression, anxiety and post-traumatic stress injuries. This course was designed to be helpful to Public Safety Personnel (PSP), who have mental health concerns and are looking for a new way to access services or are faced with barriers for accessing care. The Self-Guided PSP Wellbeing course is an internet-delivered cognitive behaviour therapy (ICBT) program. ICBT involves using the internet to deliver the same treatment content that is normally covered in face-to-face cognitive behaviour therapy (CBT) for depression, anxiety or post-traumatic stress injuries.

Covenant Health Palliative Institute: PalliPro Course

9 CE credits

PalliPro is an educational series for all Alberta health care professionals and disciplines to strengthen knowledge, skills and attitudes in providing palliative care. PalliPro can be used by individuals for professional development or by groups to explore the interdisciplinary nature of palliative care. This free online education includes interactive components and scenario-based learning.

Mental Health Structural Stigma in Healthcare; E-Learning Course

6 CE credits

Those experiencing mental health and substance use (MHSU) concerns face stigma in every aspect of their lives. No matter the context, be it personal or professional, such individuals are treated differently. Unfortunately, they also find this same kind of stigma from the health-care system, which should be a place of care and understanding that helps them access the resources and support they need to maintain good health and manage their desired wellness.

This course is intended for health system leaders and influencers, as well as any healthcare professional, who want to better understand and identify structural stigma in their organization and how it contributes to inequity and poorer experiences and health outcomes for those experiencing mental health and substance use concerns.

U of A Lifelong Learning; Heart Failure Disease Care Path Integration

6 CE credits

Heart Failure (HF) is a complex syndrome and a major public health problem. Recent (2021) updates in the Canadian Cardiovascular Society guidelines for the management of HF define a new standard of pharmacologic care for HF with reduced Ejection Fraction (HFrEF) that incorporates 4 key therapeutic drug classes as standard therapy for most patients. These foundational Guideline Directed Medical Therapies (GDMT) will be reviewed in addition to secondary therapies to improve outcomes in patients with HFrEF. Furthermore, recent evidence for Sodium-Glucose Cotransporter-2 Inhibitors (SGLT2i) for HF patients with preserved ejection fraction (HFpEF), regardless of the presence or absence of diabetes, will be presented. HF diagnosis, pathophysiology, and treatment options will also be reviewed.

This free accredited eLearning course provides an overview of Care Paths in Connect Care and details the HF-specific Care Path, identifying benefits and clinical decision supports.

Alberta Health Services: Suicide Prevention, Risk Assessment & Management (SPRAM)

18 CE Credits

Available to AHS and non-AHS Employees:

Suicide Prevention, Risk Assessment & Management (SPRAM) is an eLearning series that responds to the foundational learning needs of health care providers, particularly those working in Addiction and Mental Health (AMH). The content supports developing foundational competence in suicide prevention, risk assessment, and managing individuals at-risk for suicide. The learner can use this content in a manner that is relevant to their practice domain and is intended to complement rather than replace any existing suicide prevention training.

Opioid Response & Management Training Program

This is a free online training program, offered in collaboration with the Paramedic Association of Canada (PAC), Premergency Inc & the Canadian Standards Association (CSA). *“The Opioid Response & Management (ORM) training program is designed to empower and support **Paramedic Service Organizations** and **Community First Responders** to build an efficient Model of Care to identify and respond to opioid-related emergencies”* There are 3 program options:

- **Paramedic Toolbox** – 18 CE credits
- **Community Toolbox** – 12 CE credits
- **Instructor** – 24 CE credits

Through its national network and support from Canadian public safety personnel leadership, the Canadian Institute for Public Safety Research and Treatment (CIPSRT) responds to the identified needs of public safety personnel, clinicians, researchers, and other stakeholders. Through the facilitation of high quality and easily accessible care and resources, CIPSRT has become a hub for addressing the health research needs of personnel and their families.

Training for public safety personnel (PSP) may take on many forms, such as efforts to reduce stigma, increase knowledge, or minimize mental health disorders through resiliency training and early intervention programs. CIPSRT’s mandate further includes efforts to build long-term training capacity, accessibility, and overall wellness.

The College has developed an in-house new Continuing Competence exam opportunity for members worth 12 Continuing Education credits.

The CC Regulatory Knowledge exam was developed to educate, inform and direct members to the various legislation and documentation that guides the profession. All applicants entering the profession are required to complete the Ethics and Jurisprudence exam prior to registration. The CC Regulatory Knowledge exam is an extension of the Ethics and Jurisprudence exam with a deeper focus on the regulatory aspect of the profession. Questions in the exam are incorporated from areas of the *Health Professions Act*, Paramedic Profession Regulation, Health Professions Restricted Activity Regulation, Standards of Practice, Code of Ethics, Bylaws and College policies. **A resource guide to help members prepare for the exam can be found under the Announcements section of the member portal.**

About the exam

The exam is a 90-minute, open book format consisting of 50 questions. As the exam is timed, it must be completed in one sitting after starting it. The questions are a variety of multiple choice and true/false. The exam is granted 12 CE credits (roughly 90 minutes to review resources or unknown areas and 90 minutes to complete the exam). You must achieve a score of 80% to be considered successful.



Your results will appear after completing the exam and be viewable in your portal. Although you have unlimited attempts at the exam at no cost, we encourage you to contact the College after two unsuccessful attempts.

Accessing the Exam

Resource Document: **It is very important to read through the resource document before attempting the exam.** You can find a link for the document on the homepage of your portal, or email; CC@abparamedics.com for a copy.

The exam can be accessed through the member portal on your Home page. Select the ‘**CC Regulatory Knowledge Exam**’ when you are ready to proceed. **Do not proceed unless you are ready to complete the exam. (Make sure you are in a quiet place where you will not be disturbed.)**

Understanding Female Genital Mutilation / Cutting: A Canadian Issue.

The focus of the Joining Hands Project is to create systems of support for girls in Canada at risk of FGM/C and survivors. Professionals will be trained to spot and protect girls at risk and to give trauma-informed, culturally sensitive care to survivors. In a collaboration between survivors and subject matter experts in the fields of medicine, mental health, education, child protection and law enforcement, this project has created five distinct trauma-informed, online, interactive training modules for professionals working within FGM/C-impacted communities across Canada.

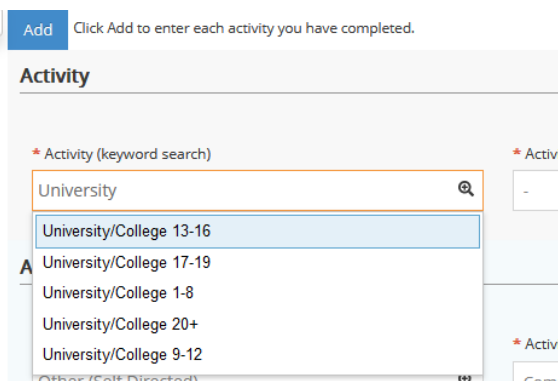

Although there is a fee for most completion certificates, the College will accept a screenshot of the member's Coursera account dashboard that shows course completion.

Set up an account on this website, then take the course. You can purchase a certificate at the end if you wish, but you don't have to. Once you have your account set up and have finished the course, take a screenshot from your dashboard that shows you completed the course. Save that screenshot as your proof and keep it for up to 5 years in case of an audit.

To enter the course and get the CE credits:

In the search bar, type the word 'University'. You can then choose the correct listing based on the number of hours of your program:



Any of the courses through any University or College that are relevant to your practice can be claimed for CE credits. Here are a few examples:
